

IFCS Visitor Survey 2025: Key Takeaways

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The research underlying this report was conducted as part of Analysis Group's employee Pro Bono Program. Results and opinions expressed herein are the work of the individual contributors to this report and do not represent any opinions or positions of Analysis Group.

A. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This memorandum provides an overview of the results of the 2025 IFCS Visitor Feedback Survey. First, **Section B** outlines survey administration and analysis, after which **Section C** describes client demographics and common drivers of need for the Market @ IFCS. **Section D** proceeds with a discussion of the parts of the IFCS experience that clients find most successful, complemented by **Section E**, which discusses opportunities for improving the IFCS experience. Lastly, **Section F** features an appendix with additional survey data. The results suggest four key takeaways:

1. Clients deeply value the services provided by the Market @ IFCS and praise the respect and care shown by staff and volunteers.
2. Individuals that shop at the Market @ IFCS frequently do not have wages or assistance sufficient to cover expenses, and often face challenges due to adverse life experiences, including recent immigration, unemployment, medical conditions, old age, or homelessness.
3. There is an opportunity to increase awareness of external support services—especially those aimed at recent immigrants, individuals with disabilities, retirees, and people experiencing homelessness.
4. Clients expressed a strong desire for more access to meat, dairy, fruits and vegetables. Many also requested the ability to visit the market more than once a month.

B. SURVEY BACKGROUND

IFCS conducted this survey during the month of April 2025 with the goal of better understanding participants' satisfaction with the Market @ IFCS ("the Market") and possible improvements to better meet their needs. The survey was available to participants shopping at the market in the format of paper forms, online with IFCS tablets/computers, and personal devices via a QR code. Participants were also given the option to take the survey at home after receiving the form. Volunteers assisted respondents in accessing the survey and were available to answer questions. Participants were incentivized to participate with an offer of entry into a raffle for a \$50 gift card upon completion of the survey.

The survey consisted of 17 questions, including two long-form, open-ended questions, two short-form, open-ended questions, and 13 closed-ended questions. The survey was developed and administered using Microsoft Word and Google Forms. Results were analyzed using Stata 18 and Microsoft Excel. The survey was provided in English, Spanish, Vietnamese, Arabic, and Russian. 529 respondents completed the survey in the language of their choice.¹

C. DEMOGRAPHICS AND CLIENT CHARACTERISTICS

As part of this survey, participants were asked to identify their race and ethnicity. Participants were first asked to indicate whether they identify as Hispanic or Latino. They were then asked to select an option that best describes their race.²

As shown in **Figure 1**, regarding ethnicity, the majority of respondents identify as Hispanic or Latino (69%). Regarding race, 35% of respondents identify as white, 6% of respondents identify as Black or African American, and fewer than 3% identify as one of American Indian, Asian, Pacific Islander, and Middle Eastern or North African.

Questions 12 and 13. Which of the following, if any, best describes your race and/or ethnicity?

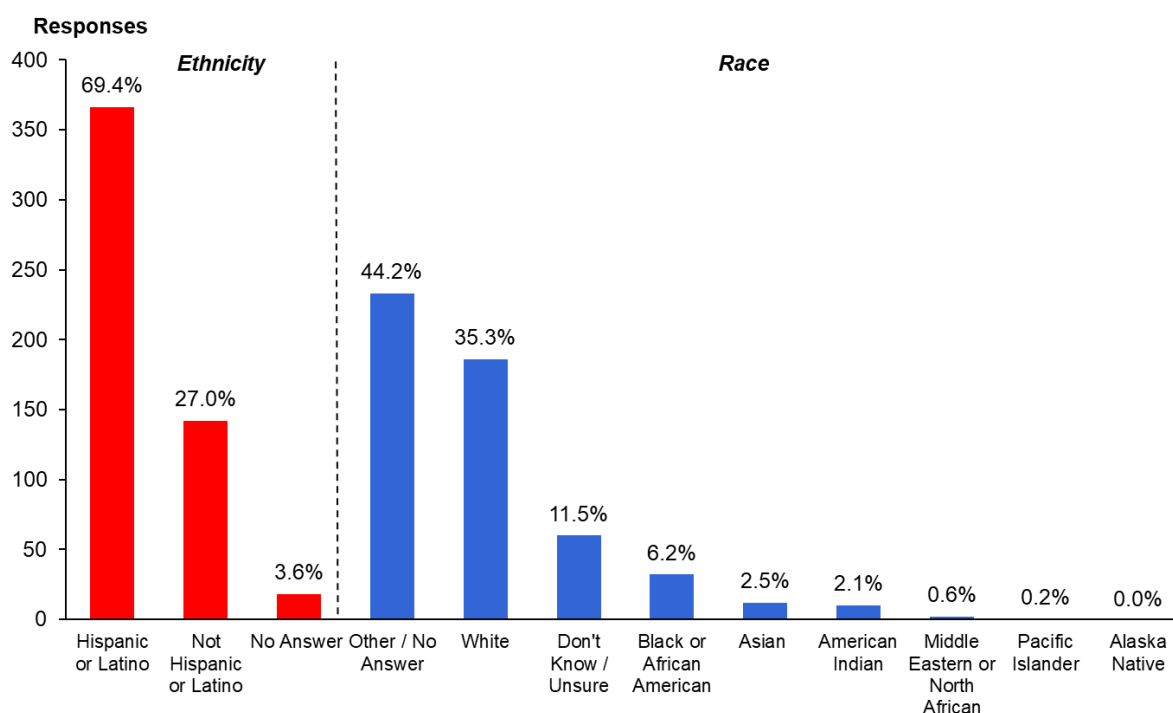
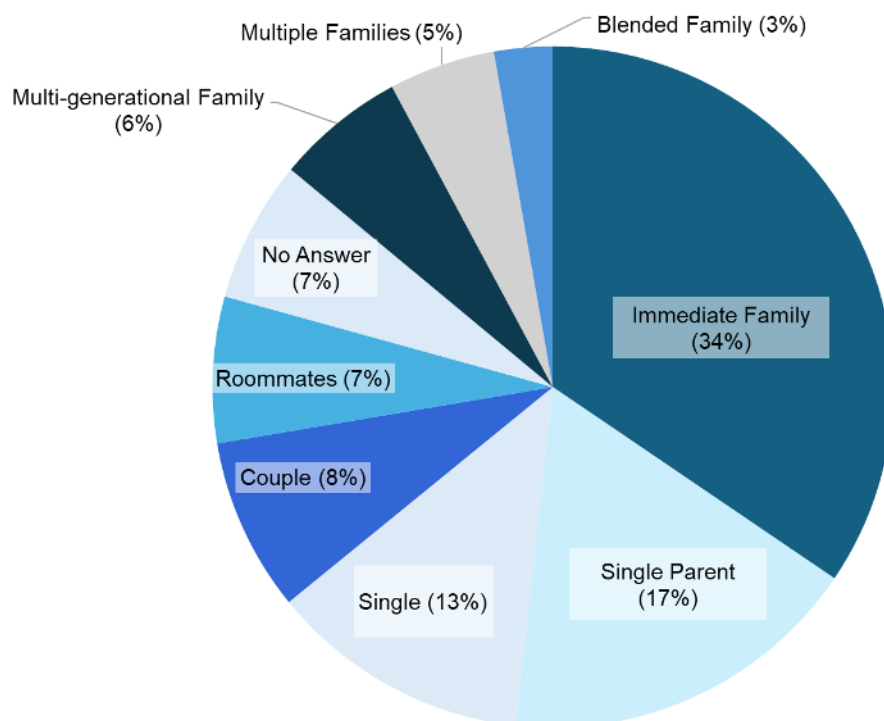


Figure 2 below shows that approximately one-third of respondents describe their household as just their immediate or nuclear family, followed by 17% of respondents describing themselves as a single parent household. Less than 10% of respondents described their household as being one of either a couple, roommates, multiple families,

blended family, or multi-generational family. The average household size is approximately four people.³

Question 15. Which of the following, if any, describes your household?⁴



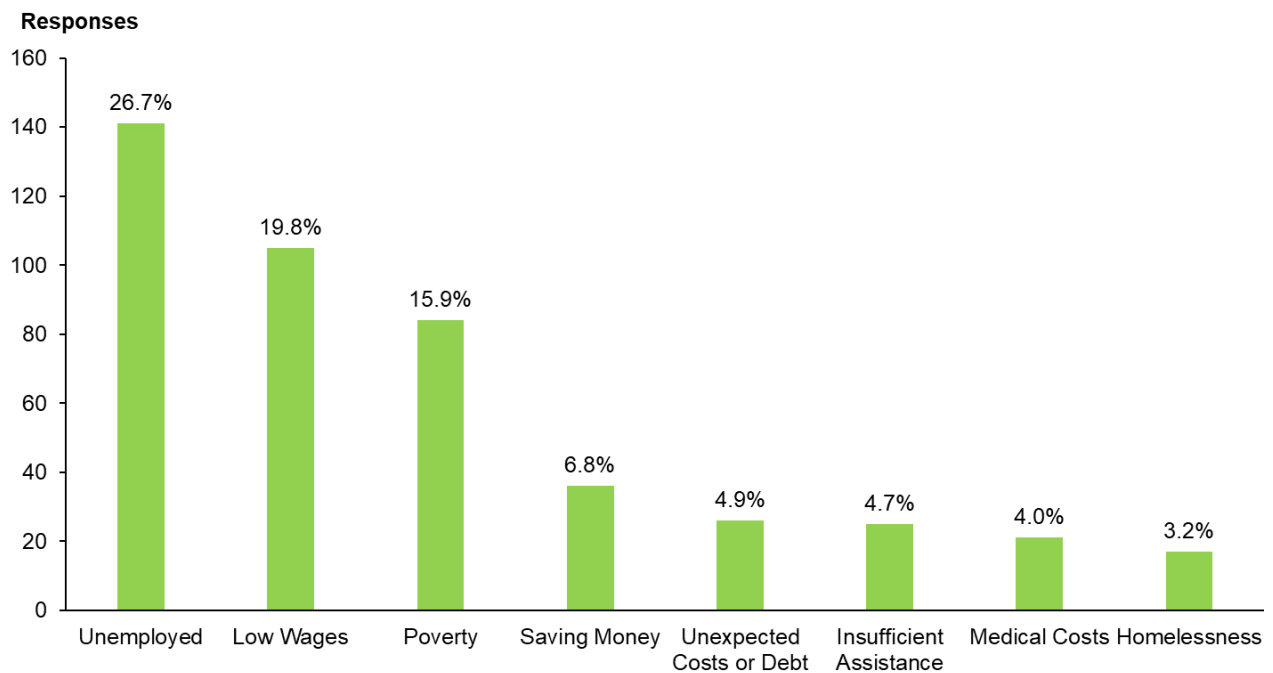
In an open-ended question, respondents were asked to describe the life circumstances that have contributed to their shopping at the Market.⁵ Respondents report facing a variety of challenges (see **Figure 3**). Discussions generally center around economic struggles, housing instability, health and family factors, and employment gaps. Specific categories identified include discussions of unemployment (27%), low wages (20%), poverty (16%), saving money (7%), unexpected costs or debt (5%), insufficient assistance (5%), medical costs (4%), and homelessness (3%).

Some example responses highlighting these challenges are listed below. See **Appendix B** for a table containing all responses to this question.

- “Current benefits or social assistance do not cover expenses, My household size grew, Sickness / medical expenses”
- “I have a lot of bills and it doesn’t balance out to have much money for food.”
- “I don’t make enough money to feed my family and I’m not able to receive food stamps.”
- “Hours cut at work/car issues interfering with contribution to groceries at home.”
- “Retired, raising 2 grandkids.”
- “Homeless for a few years, not anymore [...] Limited work as I have steel plate and 8 screws in my right hand.”
- “Disability/fixed income due to inability to work. I can’t afford all my food without visiting 2+ food banks per month.”
- “El salario no es fijo, a veces no hay trabajo y tengo gastos medicos.” (“Salary is not fixed, sometimes there isn’t any work and I have medical expenses.”)

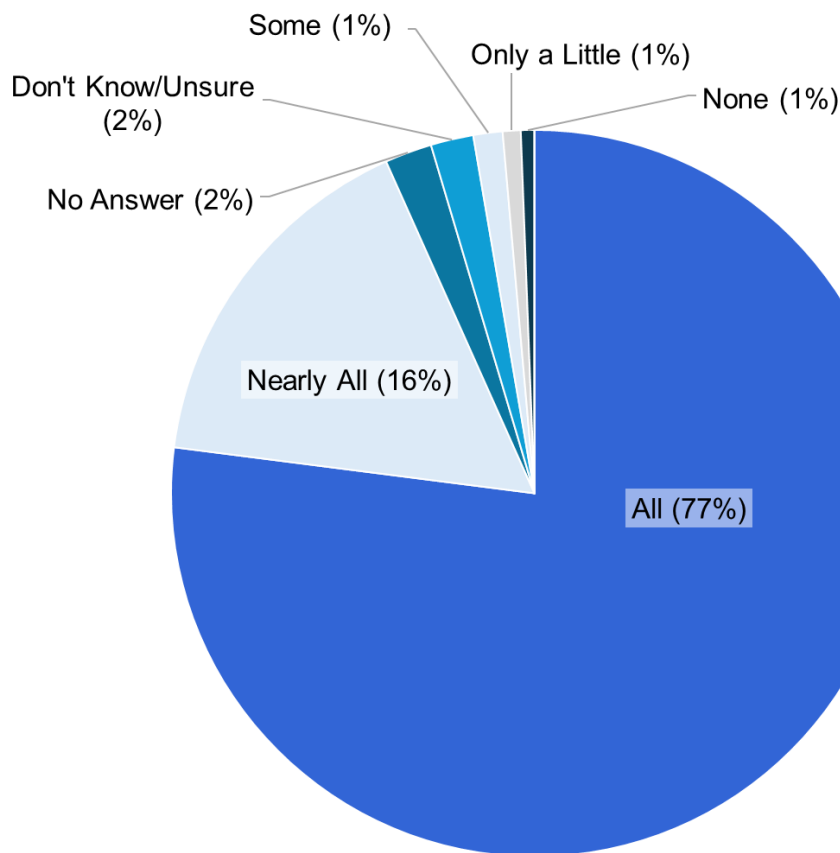
D. SUCCESSES

1. Limited Food Waste

Approximately 93% of respondents reported using all or nearly all of the food that they receive at the Market, suggesting that Market items often provide their intended benefit and limited food items are wasted in household use (see **Figure 4**).

Question 6. Of the grocery items that you receive from the Market @ IFCS, how much do you usually end up using for yourself and/or your household?⁶



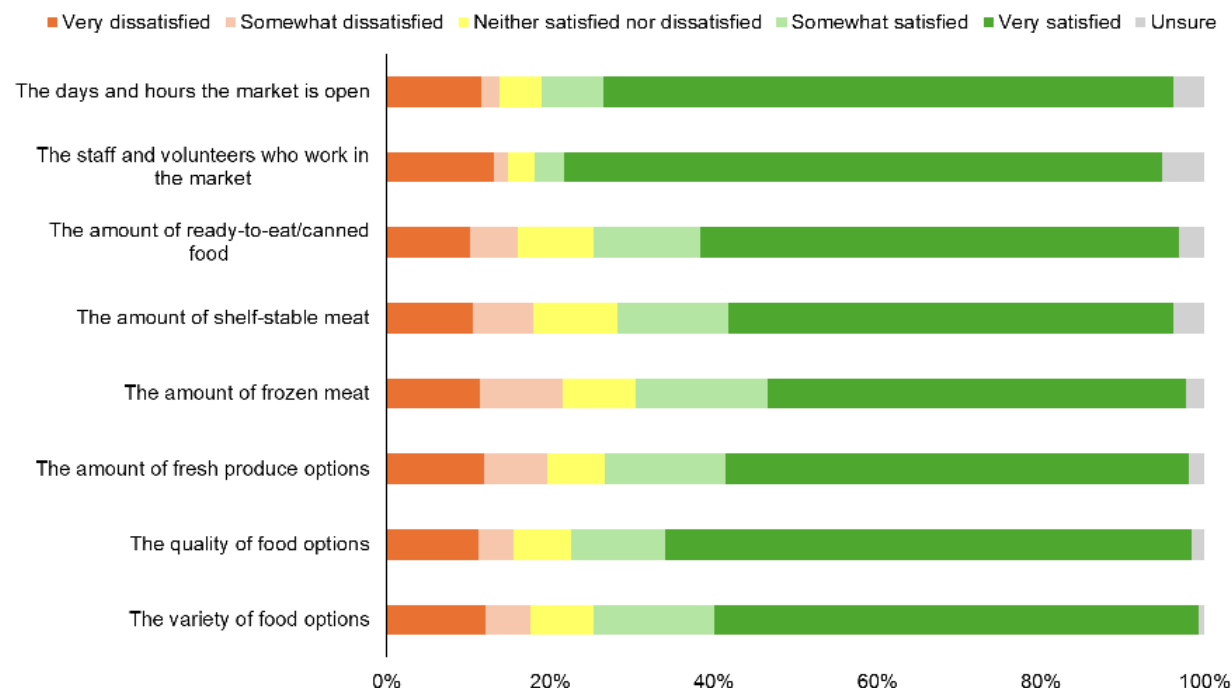
2. High Satisfaction with Market Experience, and Particularly with Staff and Volunteers

When asked to rate their satisfaction with various features of the Market on a five-point scale, respondents indicated high levels of satisfaction with many of the features (see **Figure 5**). A large percentage of respondents were very or somewhat satisfied with the staff and volunteers at IFCS (71%), the variety of food (71%), the quality of food (70%), and the days and hours the market is open (70%). Of all the questions regarding

satisfaction, respondents were most satisfied with the quality of staff and volunteers at IFCS.

Open-ended responses to Question 11 reflect these positive experiences with the Market, with over 100 respondents taking the time to write about their kind sentiments toward the Market and IFCS. These positive responses cover a range of topics, such as kind interactions with staff, the efficiency of the market, and how the Market has helped them during times of need. Some examples of these responses are below in **Table 1**. A full table of responses is included in **Appendix B**.

"todo muy bien son muy buenas personas atienden excelente toda la comida que me dan se les agradece muchas gracias por la ayuda." (Everything is great, they are very good people, the service is excellent. I appreciate all the food they give me, thank you very much for the help).

3. *Enabling Savings*

Furthermore, IFCS may allow disadvantaged families or individuals to pursue new opportunities as a result of additional savings. In response to Question 7, several survey respondents described how the Market is helping them save some of their monthly income that they otherwise would not have been able to.⁹ For example, one respondent remarked that they were saving for their rent deposit on a new apartment.¹⁰ Future surveys could assess how the Market can help shoppers save on other expenses.

E. OPPORTUNITIES AND SUGGESTIONS

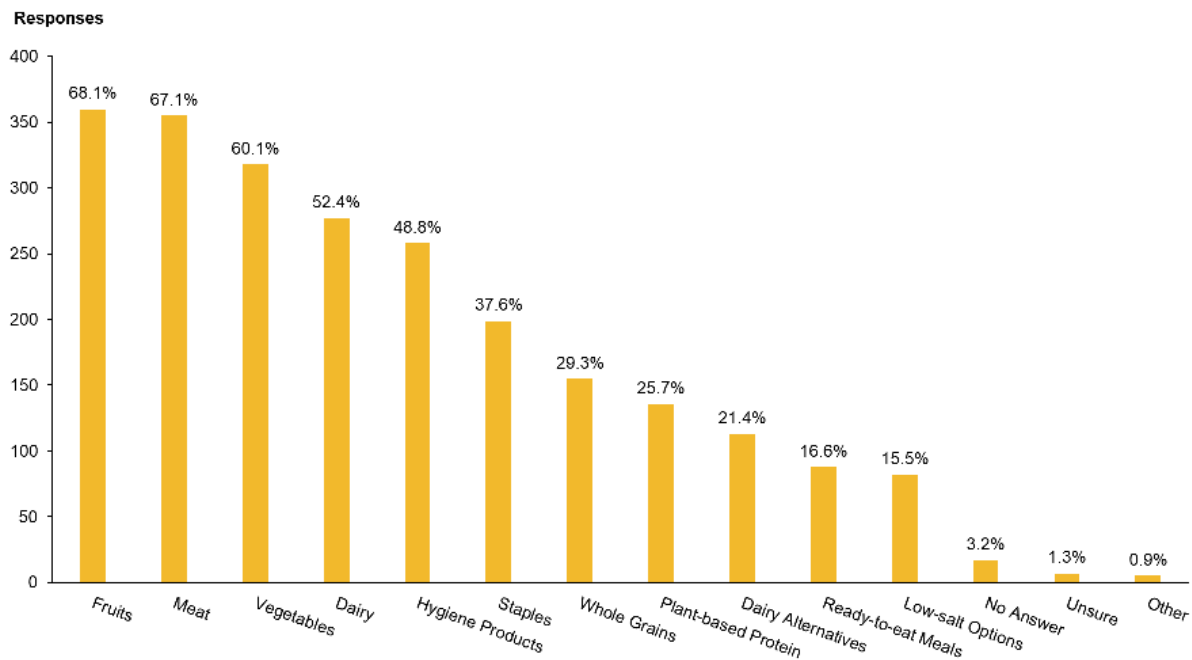
1. *Food and Supply Options*

As shown in **Figure 6**, greater than 60% of respondents would prefer more fruit, vegetables, and meat at the Market. Significant proportions of respondents also mentioned a desire for more hygiene products (49%) and staples (38%).

The desires for additional meat and produce were also reflected in the qualitative responses to Question 11, with 32 respondents requesting increased variety in the food offered by IFCS.¹² In the qualitative responses, common requests were for more meat, dairy, eggs, and fresh vegetables. 15 respondents to this open-ended question also indicated a desire for additional non-food items, including shampoo, feminine hygiene products, cleaning supplies, and clothes.

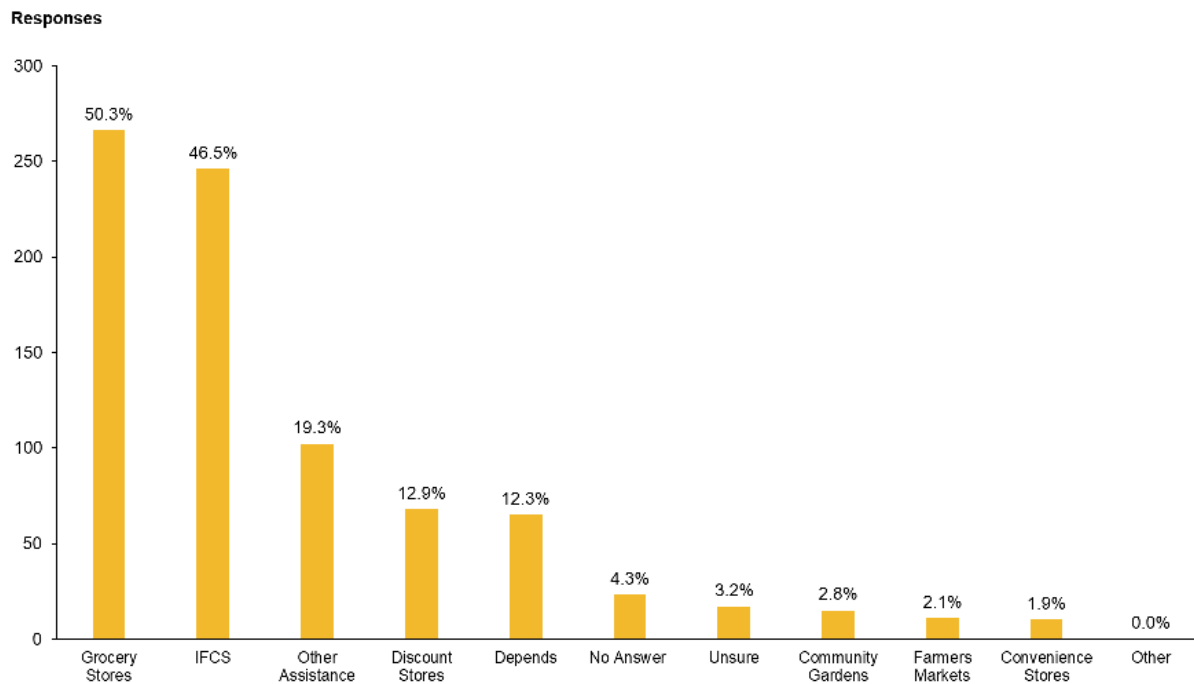
2. Food Quantity

While we understand that the Market was originally designed as a supplemental food access resource, responses suggest that many respondents rely on it as a primary food source. Nearly half of respondents reported obtaining most of their monthly supply of grocery items from the Market (see **Figure 7**).

In addition, 20% of respondents to Question 11 requested additional food and/or visits per month, indicating further support that many participants have a large reliance on the Market. Some respondents commented that making the food that they receive last a whole month is difficult, especially for larger families. This level of demand for free or subsidized food could be better supported by connecting visitors with additional resources, increasing the number of allowable visits, or permitting larger quantities of food per visit.

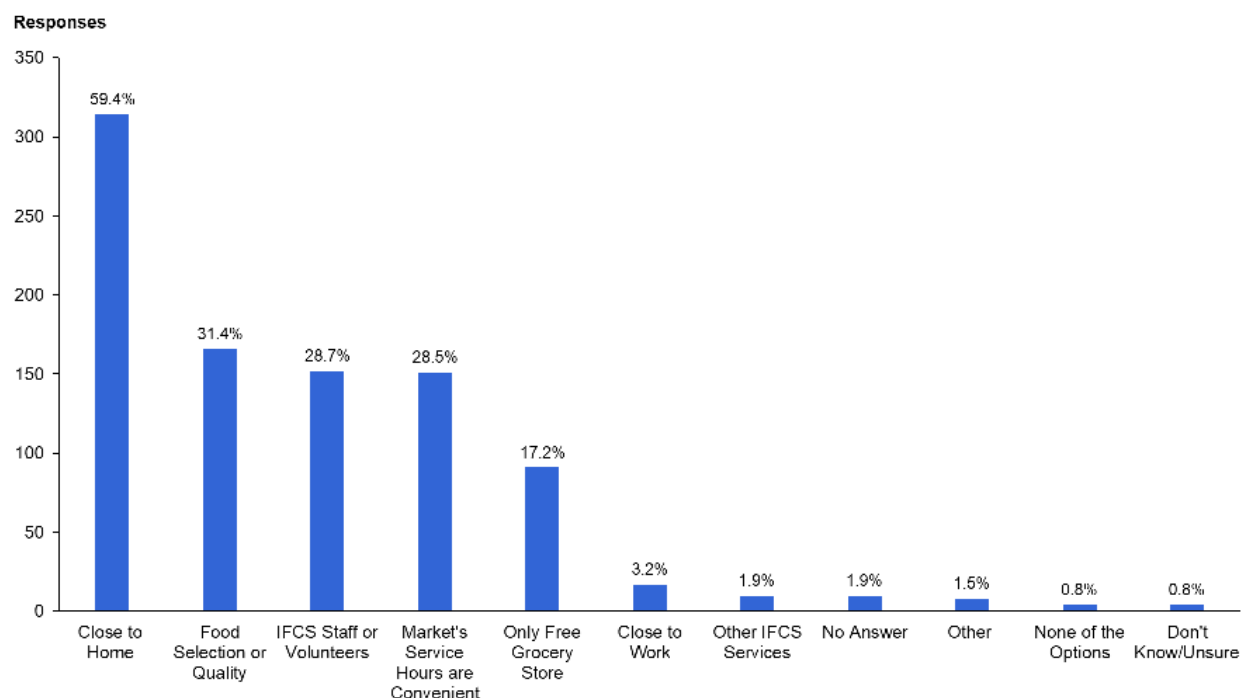
3. *Bundling with Other Services*

There may be an opportunity to bundle other services offered by IFCS with services clients already receive at the Market. Only 2% of respondents said that they chose to shop at the Market because of other services offered by IFCS (**Figure 8**), indicating a possibility that many shoppers at the Market may not be aware of these other services or are unsure about how to seek them out. The IFCS team could pursue additional marketing of other IFCS services at the Market to increase awareness of services, such as its rent and utility assistance programs.¹⁴

Relatedly, there is an opportunity to connect IFCS clients with and increase awareness of support services for common barriers they may be facing. Some respondents described their experiences as recent immigrants from other parts of the U.S. to Colorado or from other countries to the U.S.,¹⁶ confronting a disability,¹⁷ and being a retiree.¹⁸ Additionally, in Question 11, close to 5% of respondents reported struggling with homelessness or inadequate housing.¹⁹ These members of the population face distinct challenges and may have limited awareness of other potential resources. As they shop at the Market, there may be an opportunity to provide information or guidance to IFCS

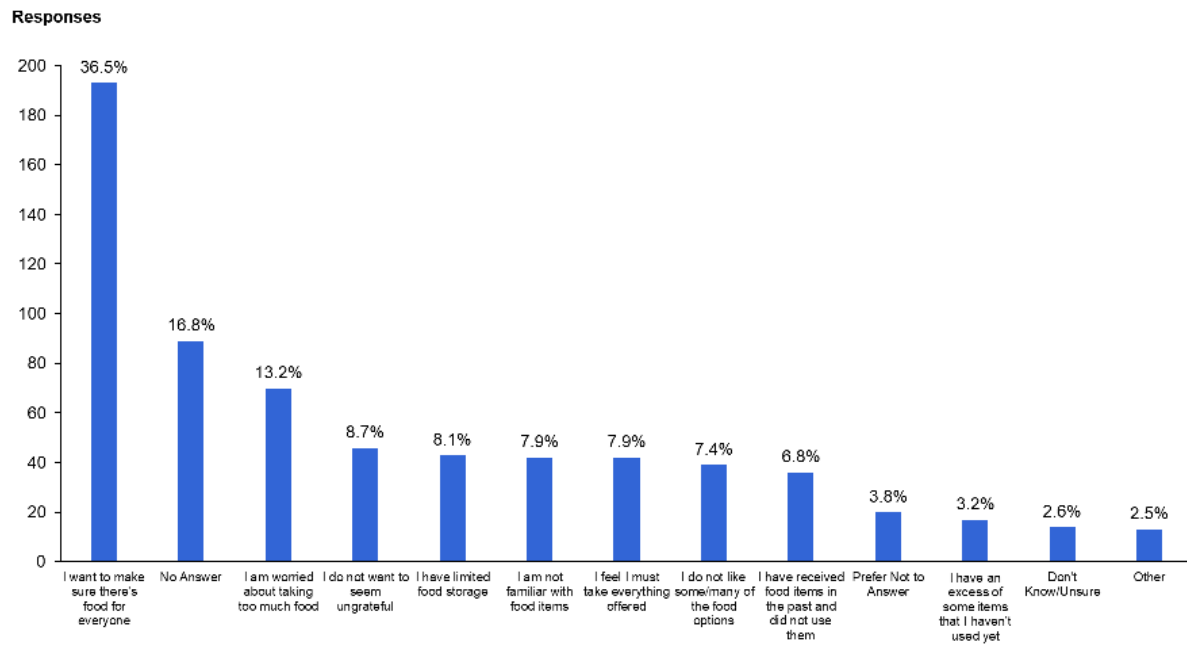
clients that are part of populations with unique challenges (e.g., immigrants, disabled individuals, elderly) about how they may access additional economic support, such as through available government programs or other community organizations.

4. Messaging Related to Food Quantity

It may be worth exploring improved clarity and guidance around the rationale for the quantity of food allocated to each shopper. As seen in **Figure 9**, over a third of respondents reported that wanting to ensure that all shoppers have enough food influenced the amount of grocery items that they take from the Market. Approximately 9% of respondents indicated that they did not want to appear ungrateful, and approximately 8% felt that they must take all food offered to them.

Because many respondents reported concerns about taking too much food, making sure that other IFCS families have sufficient food, and not wanting to seem ungrateful, the IFCS team may want to consider explicit messaging to shoppers before they enter the Market to ensure shoppers know the amount of food they can take and that they aren't obligated to take what they won't use. This messaging may include the following: they are not mandated to take all food offered to them, a set amount of food is allocated based on family size, and that monthly and quarterly planning about client volume helps to estimate the amount of food allotted per household. By having clear directions to address potential concerns about food volume and how food is allotted to households, shoppers can be empowered to select food based on their own household needs, rather than their perceptions about the needs of IFCS or other households.

Question 4. Which of the following factors, if any, influence the amount of grocery items you take with you from the Market @ IFCS?²⁰

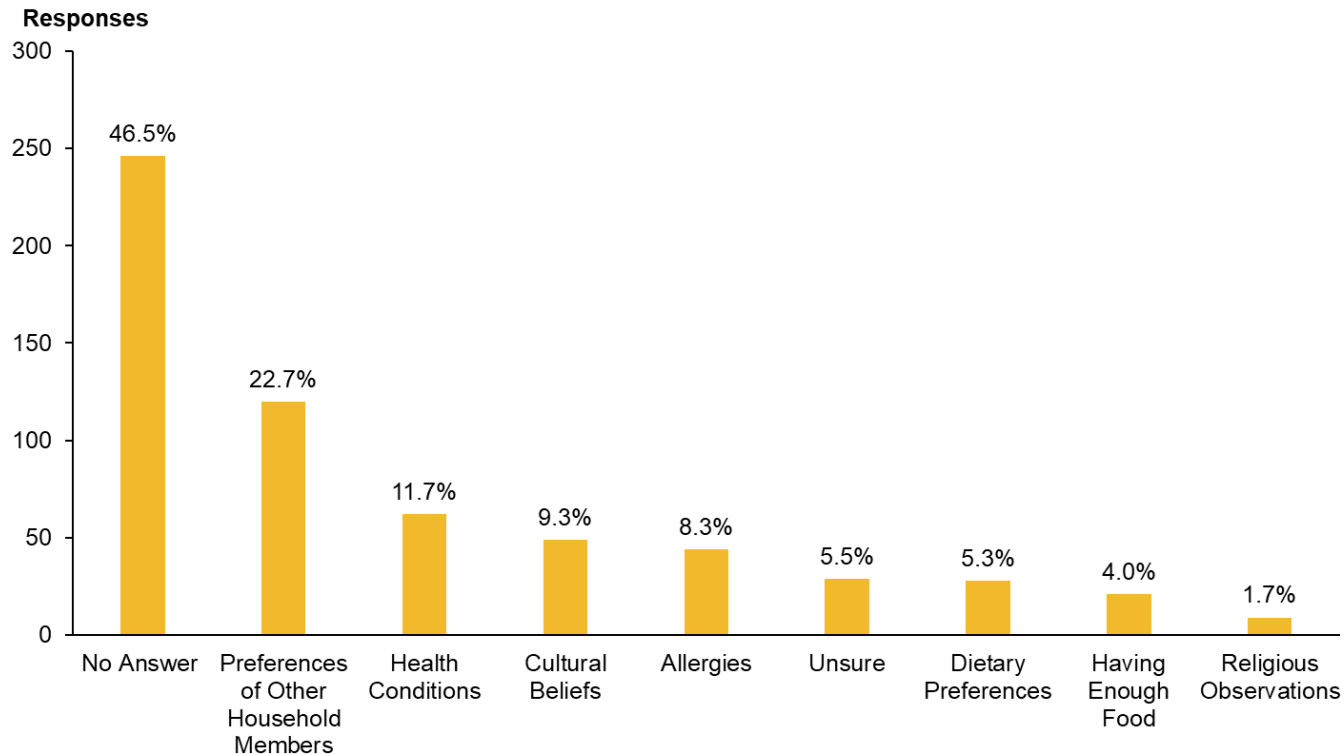

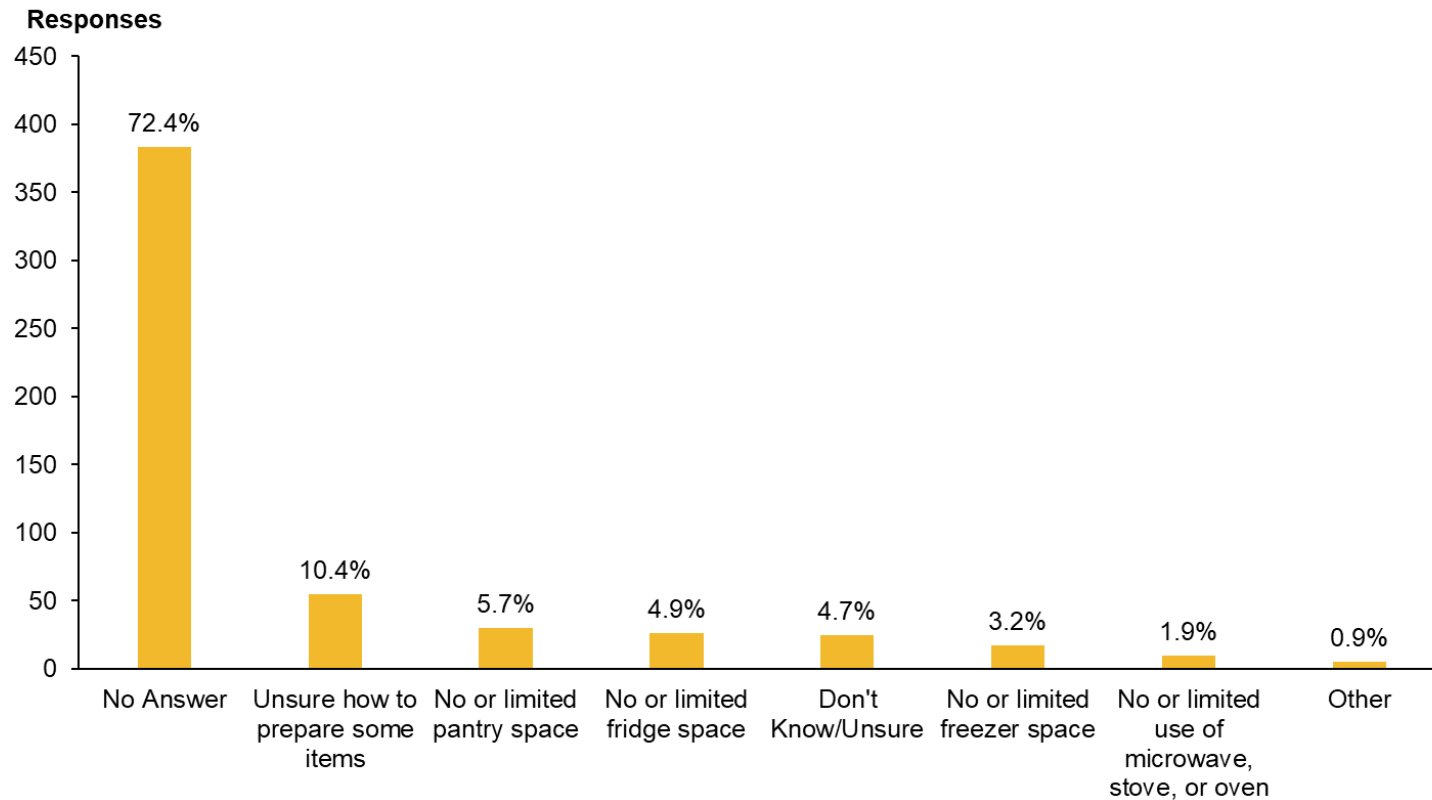
Question 3. Which of the following factors, if any, influence your choice of the foods you select for yourself and/or your household at the Market @ IFCS?²¹

Less than 15% of respondents noted that one of allergies, health conditions, religious observations, dietary preferences, or cultural beliefs impact the food that they shop for in the Market.

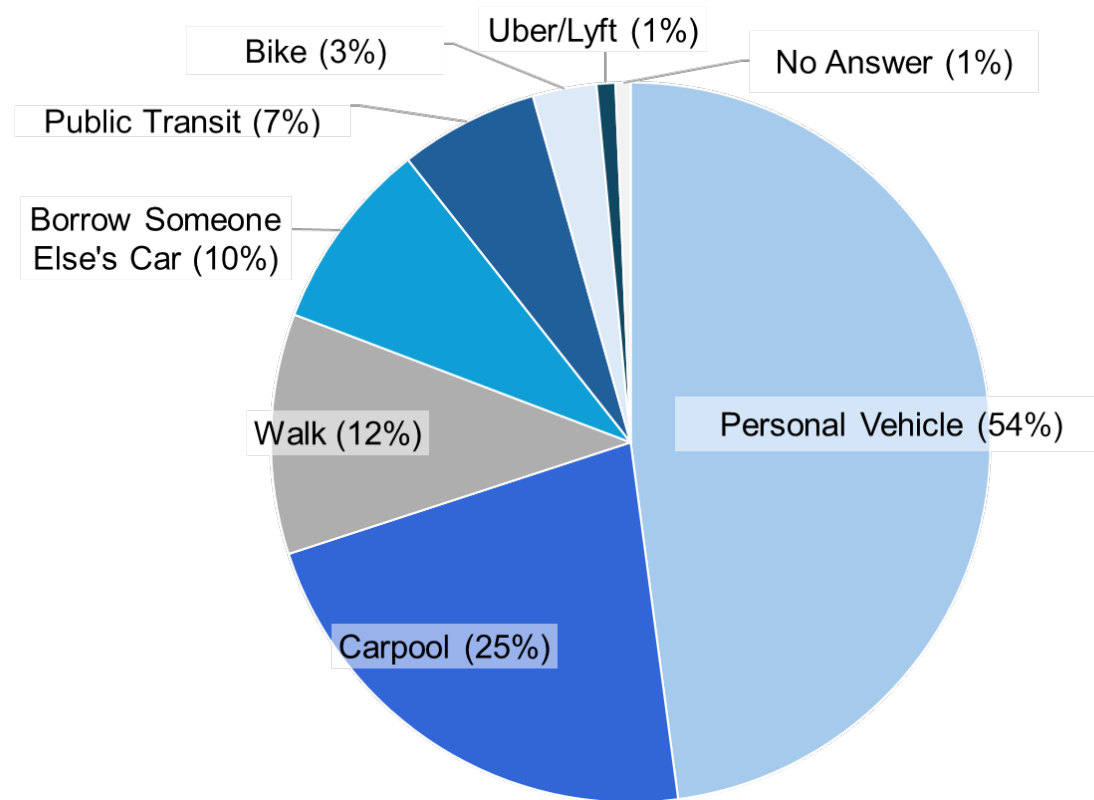

Question 5. What challenges, if any, do you and/or your household have with storing and preparing food you receive from the Market @ IFCS?²²



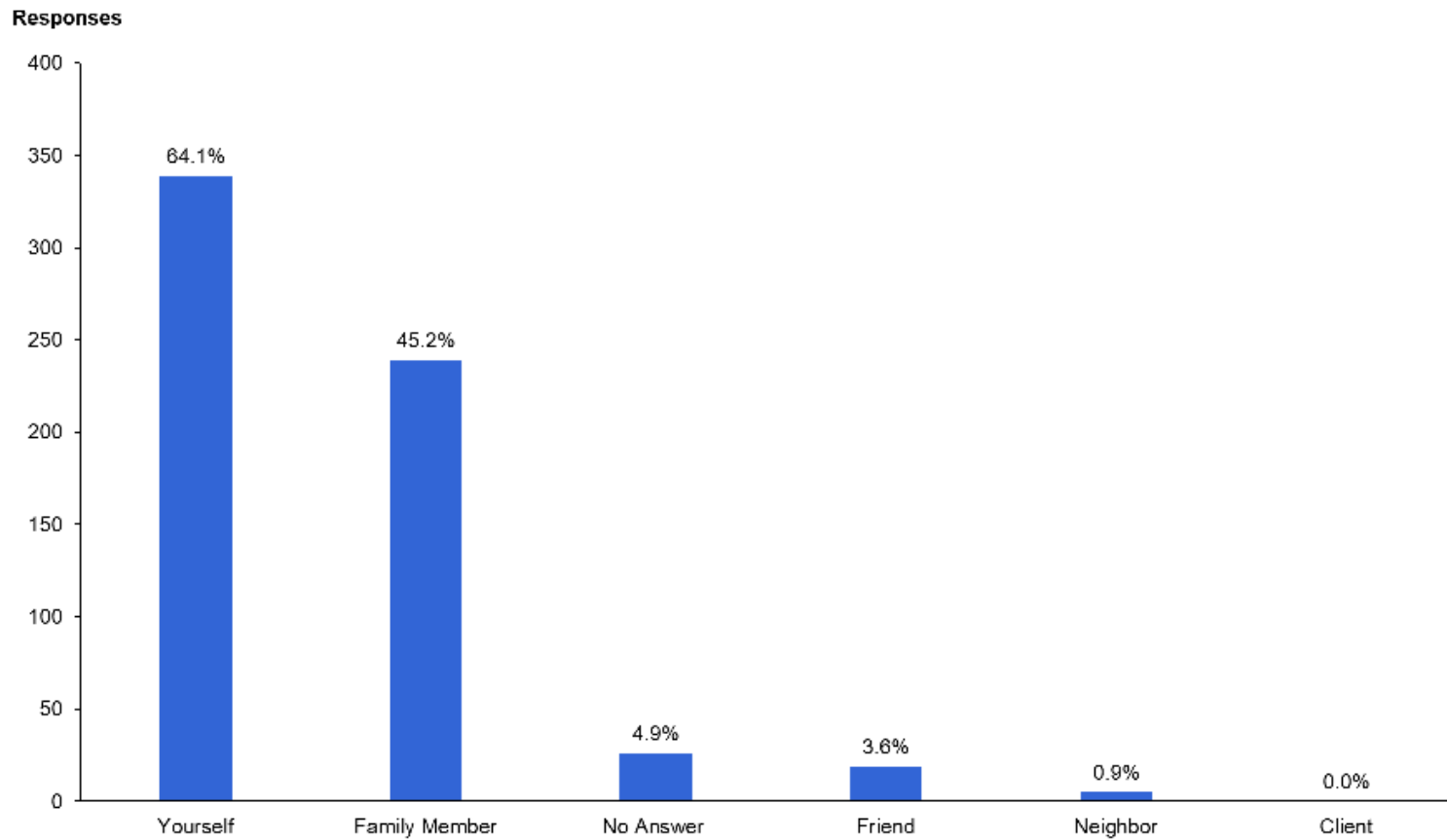

However, 10% of respondents were unsure of how to prepare some of the food items at IFCS. Given this barrier, there is potential to increase cooking awareness of certain ingredients that are provided through recipe examples next to the item at the store, or monthly cooking classes using ingredients from the store.

Only 7% of shoppers answered that they use public transit to arrive to the Market. While there are limited options for IFCS to redress a lack of public transit in the Denver Metropolitan area, there may be an opportunity to subsidize costs of public transit tickets or increase awareness of routes and stops nearby the market.
